
However, I am really struck by something that I just can't get away from. God doesn't want to do this alone. God wants to do this not only in us, me and you, but through us as well.

## *Riverside Update – Mission Sundays*

This Summer will see us as Riverside Elim Church start to reopen and re gather, as the Government restrictions allow of course. This will see us slowly rephrase back in how we are meeting, but also looking again at how we do mission. During step 3 with the restrictions in place we have a booking in system in place for attending Sunday services – you should have received a letter about that but if not, get in touch.

Until September, whether we are in step 3 or step 4 we will be doing something different on the last Sunday of the month. We want to have some Sundays that will be solely MISSION focused.

The last Sunday of the month in June, July and August will be mission focused, centered on an evangelistic message from some incredible speakers. There will be no in person services on these Sundays (27/6, 25/7 and 28/8) but instead a shorter evangelistic service online only.

This is a great opportunity for you to invite neighbours, family and friends over to your house and hear a short evangelistic talk and the opens a door for you to share the gospel and your faith with folk who need it.

This will only have an impact though if you invite people over and do this WITH others. This isn't simply directing others to watch it, but inviting people to come and watch it and experience it WITH you! This is a great missionary opportunity for you to be involved in sharing the gospel with people in your life. I'm really excited

about these opportunities. And when we step out boldly in faith, trusting in God, this is when we see real breakthrough. This is an opportunity to share the gospel with people around you.



Why not invite them over for a bacon sandwich (vegetarian options are available) and have breakfast and share the gospel together? Hopefully in July and August restrictions will have lifted enough for us to then have a lunchtime gathering on these Sundays too, where you can come, with the people you've spent the morning with, to the Dog Lane building. Enjoy some lunch together. We can share community together and continue to share the love of God with each other and some who may have never been to a church before. Again, this only works if you, 1) invite someone, and, 2) show up. More information will come out about this in July when we know more about what restrictions are or aren't in place.

We need to be reaching people for Jesus and throughout the summer we will trial this for 3 months and see what happens. I really believe this is an opportunity and time where we can see people give their lives to Christ. But God wants us all to play a part on that mission. So play a part this Summer and invite people to join you on mission Sunday, and when we can, bring them down to Dog Lane for lunch, community and a chance to see and experience more of God. We want to see His kingdom here!

Elisha's servant could see only the enemy and Elisha prayed that the Lord would open his eyes to see the chariots and the army of God standing on the hills.

They said you were out in the garden hanging up the washing and they watched you as they set their mortars in position. Suddenly, they saw four shining soldiers about nine feet tall, standing at each corner of the house, holding glowing shields and swords. They were so frightened that they left all their weapons and ran straight into the arms of the security forces and surrendered.

No matter what you're doing today be assured that God is with you and if He's with you then His angels will be with you too.

**Elim Missions  
The Philippines**

Pray for **Lynette Orange**, originally from Rugby Elim she is now working at City Gates Academy - a nursery and infant school set up in Manila by Elim in order to provide free education to the poorest children.

In exchange for free education, parents surrender 12 hours of work each month, giving them a sense of dignity, worth and community, not just receiving hand outs.

At the moment Lynette is in the UK, awaiting a visa to return to Manila, and for covid travel restrictions to lift, and yet is still working with the school. Lynette and her colleagues faced the seemingly impossible. How do they take quality education to their pupils with no Internet access, and no resources. God provided – SD cards and tablets were given to the children, the teachers recorded 12 lessons each week, and gave out home packs with books, paper, resources etc to over 110 children. No one was left behind.

Give God praise for this. Classes have now ended for the summer break, yet work continues preparing for the new school year, and Lynette says that despite the distance they (the teachers) are meeting regularly online, and she is very much involved with preparing and editing training videos, especially as 4 new teachers hope to join them for the new academic year. God is very much at work at City Gates Academy, please pray for them.

In addition the families have received Bible study notes and copies of sermons, again on SD cards.

Pray for children and adults, families and the community at City Gates, to KNOW Him better, to know his strength and his provision.

## Summer Devotion

One of the pieces of scripture that is really important for me this summer is Psalm 85:6-9 which says,

*6 Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?*

*7 Show us your unfailing love, LORD, and grant us your salvation.*

*8 I will listen to what God the LORD says; he promises peace to his people, his faithful servants - but let them not turn to folly.*

*9 Surely his salvation is near those who fear him,  
that his glory may dwell in our land.*

Why don't you spend some time this summer really calling out to God in prayer using these verses? Below are four devotions – one for each week. A focus for your prayers for a week and see what difference these prayers and verses have in your heart. Each week will have some scripture reading, a simple prayer and an opportunity to do something.

### Week 1 – Each day read Psalm 85:6 aloud

Lord, please will you revive my heart again for the things of you? I want to rejoice in all your ways. Please lead me in the ways you want this week. God, I am open to you. Lead me. Revive me. Amen

*Spend some time after praying this listening to God. Maybe write down what passions He puts on your heart and this week step out in these areas. Let God revive your heart and actions again.*

### Week 2 – Each day read Psalm 85:7 aloud

Lord, I need to see more of your unfailing love. Fill me again with your love. Speak to me and encourage me with your love. I am so thankful for my salvation and trust you entirely to lead me in your ways. Amen

*Think who you could show some of God's love to this week and step out boldly, trusting God to lead you in showing them His unfailing love. Each day also give thanks to God for His love for you.*

### Week 3 – Each day read Psalm 85:8 aloud

God, I will listen to you and do what you ask of me knowing what you ask is good and loving. Thank you for leading me. Thank you for your promise to be close to me and never leave nor forsake me. Help me Lord to never forget this. Amen

*Spend some time each day in quiet, either inside or outside. Simply making yourself available to God to speak to. Make a space for Him every day and see what happens!*

## Week 4 – Each day read Psalm 86:9 aloud

## Sat 7 Satellite Television



Since the 13th June we have been able to meet in person again for church at St George's Hall. It was so great to gather again.

However for the previous 15 months we have relied on our mobile phones (face book), tablets and TV's (You Tube) to keep us connected as a church family. Plus the occasional in person gathering of 2-6 people in outdoor spaces. We may have mixed feelings about modern technology but it has kept us connected and it is being used for the spread of the gospel around the world.

I'd like to tell you something about a Christian Charity Sat 7.

### The History of Sat 7

“As Dr Terence Ascott rushed around busy Cairo streets one day in the late 1980s, he spotted something in his neighbourhood. Sitting on a cement floor in an unfinished building was a family watching television.

Staring at this strange sight, he came to the stark realisation that the majority of the population in Egypt and across the Middle East could not read. Although he had been in publishing for several years, he perceived that many, like this family, would never have the opportunity to read about the love of God.”

That day a vision was born. Dr Ascott no longer just saw one family but millions. It was a realisation that birthed a dream: to establish Christian satellite television that would reach across the Middle East and North Africa.

**Our Vision** is to see a growing Church in the Middle East and North Africa, confident in Christian faith and witness, serving the community and contributing to the good of society and culture. We make God's love visible.

A respected counsellor writes: 'All blame is a waste of time. Regardless of how much fault you find, it will not change things. The only thing blame does is keep the focus off you when you're looking for reasons to explain your unhappiness or frustration.'

You may succeed in making someone else feel guilty, but you won't succeed in changing whatever's making you unhappy.'

Blaming others is often just a way of avoiding the truth about yourself.
